RULES AND REGULATIONS: (English & Western)

1. Exhibits are subject to all rules in the Maryland 4-H Horse and Pony Rule Book. The rule book may be downloaded at www.4hhorse.umd.edu/documents/4H266layout08.pdf
2. All Pony and Horse Exhibits staying the week Must be on the grounds by 4:00 P.M. Monday, August 10, 2009. Pony and horse exhibits showing for the day must be on the grounds by 8:00 A.M. show day.
3. If you have a stall you must compete in herdsman. (1 animal may stay for the week) Show Day Exhibitors may or may not have stall occupancy depending on the availability.
4. Stall Assignments:
 - A. One animal per exhibitor
 - B. If you had a stall in 2008 you will be offered one in 2009 if, you turned your record book, and there were no infractions at the fair in previous years.
 - C. Vacant stalls will be filled using the following criteria;
 1. Number of years carrying the horse project.
 2. Record book turned in the previous year.
 3. Total number of years occupying a stall at the county fair.
 4. Must attend at least 75% of your club meeting & scheduled activities for the year 2009 .
5. If Exhibitor cannot stay over-night, he or she must see that the animal is taken care of.
6. Ponies and Horses shall be under control and a safe distance apart at all times, both in and out of the ring.
7. The exhibitor will be the only one allowed to work on his/her animals during the entire fair week .
8. A negative “Coggins test” is required, along with a Maryland 4-H Horse & Pony Registration Card on file by May 1, 2009 in the County 4-H Office.
9. The Committee will not be responsible for any accident which may occur to any rider, attendants, animals, equipment or spectators at the Show.
10. No person will be allowed in the Show Ring during the time of Judging, except the Exhibitor and those having duties to perform.
11. Classes may be substituted, combined or dropped at the discretion of the Show Committee.
12. An individual may enter up to 7 classes between both show days. Fitting and showing will not be counted as one of the 7. Model classes are included in the seven classes allowed. Exhibitors showing in the English division will be permitted to cross enter in the 3 jumping classes.
13. Rosettes and Trophies will be offered for each Class.
14. Ties will be broken by having a ride-off judged in that particular division class.

1st - \$7.00, 2nd - \$6.00, 3rd - \$5.00, 4th - \$4.00, 5th - \$3.00, 6th - \$2.00

Premiums are awarded to registered projects of Queen Anne's County 4-H'ers only!!!

Grooming and showmanship - (Judging will be based on the cleanliness of the animal and the manner in which the animal is groomed and the way it is presented to the Judge. Participants in this class will lead their animal at a walk and trot, and stand it for inspection. Projects will be exhibited with bridle or halter.
